## **Background to the Workshop**

This practical workshop will provide participants with the skills and knowledge to carry out a practical risk assessment of the barriers and obstacles preventing the organisation from Going Digital and using Digital documents only.

## **Course Objectives**

On completion of the course, participants will be able to:

- Assess the different interpretations of what Going Digital means to an organisation.
- Identify, assess, and evaluate any barriers and obstacles preventing the organisation from Going Digital.
- The course will provide the training participants with a method to progressively remove the barriers and obstacles to Going Digital as outlined below.

## **Course Outcomes**

It is known that within many organisations today, there are at least a few business processes/operations which are still using paper (physical/hard copy) somewhere.

## It is also known:

- most documents today are born digital, because most of them are created using a Microsoft Office product such as Word or Excel.
- only a very small number of documents today are created on a typewriter or handwritten.
- most organisations are already either digitising/scanning any documents they receive in physical format/hard copy, or they are now receiving most documents in digital format only.
- most documents that are created on a typewriter or handwritten are usually digitised and legitimately converted to digital format as stated above.

So why is it that many organisations still have several business processes/operations that still use physical documents somewhere?

The Overcoming Barriers to Going Digital training course will support training participants:

- to fully test the many and varied reasons that your organisation has not been able to Go Digital.
- to then evaluate, address, and/or mitigate each of those reasons.

The course uses a Risk Assessment process based on the following four key aspects:

- The Digitisation process used within the organisation,
- Legal requirements,
- Business requirements, and
- Technological requirements.
